Dear Dr. Smith,

I am writing as a the Co-Head of UBC Social & Cultural Psychiatry Program. We once had a Cross-Cultural Psychiatry Outpatient Clinic (established in 1988) based at Vancouver Hospital that provided ethnocultural mental health services in up to 10 different languages with ethnic matched psychiatrists who worked in the system. Unfortunately a decision was made to close the program in 2018. For the past few years the immigrant mental health needs of Greater Vancouver have not been met by any 'general clinic", we are struggling to provide culturally competent training sites for our psychiatry residents and the ability to do research has also been impacted without a clinical site.

We all know that for decades AIM has been a culturally competent program that it had been instrumental in addressing the mental health inequities experienced by Chinese and Asian Canadians in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA). It has served as an exemplary model for the University Health Network (UHN) and the University of Toronto, earning broad recognition. At a time of national and international retrenchment against equity, diversity, and inclusion in mental health, the closure of an ethnic-focus clinic, such as AIM, sends the wrong message to the GTA, the patients of the UHN, and the international community.

I request that you reconsider re-instating the AIM clinic and engage in meaningful dialogue with the affected stakeholders to restore the trust and partnership that is necessary to continue with the good work in providing culturally competent mental health care in GTA.
